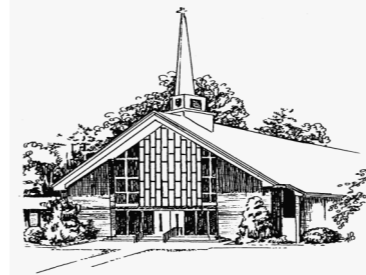

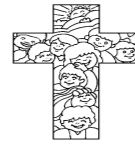
Hey! Don't forget our **Come Home to Woodland Luncheon** following the morning worship service. And there will be a dinner meal at 6:00 each evening of the services.

Sept. 11 will be wonderful as we celebrate the heritage and history of Woodland and our faith! Harmony Handbells are ringing two fabulous pieces: “God of Grace” and “Soon and Very Soon”. These pieces are so fantastic! “Soon and Very Soon” has numerous bell techniques and is so dramatic with its fast tempo and jazzy bass! Ring touch (ringing the bell and stopping the sound by touching it to the shoulder), malleting (striking the bell with a mallet), martellatos (striking the body of the handbell horizontally on the table)—are showstoppers.

The choir is singing one of my favorite anthems: “How Lovely is Thy Dwelling Place”. This anthem quotes scripture from Psalm 84: 1-2. Sarah Ochoa will join the choir in presenting this gorgeous anthem with a chorus added to the end that will give you goose bumps! The hymns of the day are the great hymns of faith and each have trumpet accompaniment and trumpet descants. Greg Campbell will join us in the loft with his wonderful trumpet.

REVIVE! each evening in the sanctuary through Tuesday will feature music unique to each night. Contemporary on Monday, Chancel Choir on Tuesday singing “Blessed Assurance” and Gospel on Tuesday! Each night promises to be inspiring and uplifting. Monday and Tuesday piano music will include “Like a River Glorious”, “Wonderful Words of Life”, “Brethren (Friends), We Have Met to Worship”, “Bound for the Promised Land”, “Amazing Grace” and “The Solid Rock”. So, if you’ve been wanting some good old Southern toe-tapping piano music, don’t miss a single evening!
